



“A Welcoming Congregation”

You have heard us talking about becoming a Reconciling in Christ (RIC) Community. Whether or not you have joined us at the adult forum the past two months, all members will be asked to vote on joining the RIC community at the upcoming Congregational meeting in January, so it is important to understand what we are hoping to do. We are not trying to change St. Mark's into somewhere new or push current members away. The organization that we have been working with, Reconciling Works, says it best, “ReconcilingWorks respects and honors the need of some for safe space and sanctuary due to fear of oppression for who they are or because of whom they love.”

If approved by the congregation, we would post our welcoming statement (see draft below) on the website, display the RIC logo publicly, and continue to search for opportunities to be welcoming and affirming of people no matter what their sexual orientation or gender identity.

Lutherans Concerned for Gay People was founded in June 1974, at the University of Minnesota. For 45 years, the organization now known as ReconcilingWorks: Lutherans for Full Participation has advocated for the full welcome, inclusion, and equity of LGBTQIA+ Lutherans in all aspects of the life of their Church, congregations, and community. 

Blue Christmas

A service for all of us who struggle during the holidays.

For many people, the approaching Christmas holiday does not bring with it the joy and happiness advertised on television or in greeting cards. Psychologists have long known that the contrived good cheer of the holiday season can actually make some people who are dealing with heartbreak feel worse.

Holidays in our culture are often about families, and families are not always happy institutions. The "Blue Christmas" concept serves an important function for those who have lost loved ones. The biggest relief for people who are grieving comes when it is named. The Blue Christmas service confronts feelings of grief and loss head-on. Cultures across the world have festivals of light this time of year. It is really dark, and it is really a hard time for many people. This church service acknowledges just how dark the dark is.

Blue Christmas services include an emphasis on candles, with people in the congregation invited to come forward and light a candle in memory of someone or to mark an event in their lives. These services have a more quiet, somber feel than a traditional Christmas worship service. Scripture, music and reflections focus on the comfort God offers during dark times, the "winter of our souls."

The festivities of the season seem to magnify the grief or pain people are experiencing. The commercials tout "Joyous Noel" and carolers sing "Tidings of comfort and joy"... but many among us have hearts that are breaking.

Council Highlights

November 14, 2019

The SMLC Council held it's monthly meeting on November 14 at 5:00 p.m.

- Pastor Karen led devotions entitled "Removing Obstacles" based on Isaiah 57:14
- Minutes of October 17 meeting were approved as amended.
- Stew Irwin, Chair of the Budget Committee reviewed the committee's work today and indicated that our projected income for 2020 is significantly less than our projected expenses. Cuts will need to be made. He made some suggestions for the council to consider. The conversation will continue and the committee will present their recommendations to the council at their December 12 meeting.
- Financial reports were reviewed and approved. Nancy indicated that revenues were lower in October than last year; expenses were also lower due in part to Pastor's disability.
- Council approved allowing the Wednesday Club to sell cookbooks as a fundraiser on Sunday, November 17.
- Council approved the Letter of Offer for Roland Lubin as part-time Director of Contemporary Music.
- Council approved the appointment of Carrie Findleton to the Preschool Board.
- Council discussed this year's Christmas Eve family service activities.
- Council received a report from Worker's Comp that allows Pr. Karen to return to work on a limited basis (25 hours/week)
- Council received information: Christmas Basket give away will be held on Monday, December 16 at 3:30 p.m. Tickets are available on Tuesdays from 3:30 – 5:30 at the Food Pantry.


